Can the Government please provide a breakdown of where and how all the monies deposited in the Gibraltar Savings Bank have been invested and the rate of return on each of these investments as at 30 November 2016?

ANSWER

The average yield in respect of the different categories of investment vehicles held by the Savings Bank Fund for the month in question are as follows:-

On-call accounts with the Bank of England, the Bank of New York, Royal Bank of Scotland, Lloyds Bank and Gibraltar Banks had an average yield of around 0.2%. The Gibraltar Banks were the Barclays Bank, National Westminster Bank, Jyske Bank and the Gibraltar International Bank.

Floating Rates Notes quoted on the London Stock Exchange had an average yield of 0.8%. The Floating Rates Notes were issued by the following; EIB Floating Rate, Suncorp Metway Ltd, KfW, BK Nederlandse Gemeenten FRN, ABS Finance Ltd London FRN, Toronto Dominion Bank, Royal Bank of Canada, Lloyds Bank, Stadshypotek AB, European Investment, Daimler, BMW Finance, LVMH MOET Hennessy VUITT, Prudential plc, BNP Paribas, Abbey National Treasury, Total Capital, Dexia Credit Local, Scotland Gas network plc, Barclays Bank plc, Scottish and Southern Energy, ABN Amro Bank NV, Close Brothers Fin Plc, Bank of Nova Scotia, Government of Gibraltar Debentures.

Monthly Income Debentures with a 6% return, and preference shares in Credit Finance with an average dividend of 5.6%. As previously explained, quoted stocks and call accounts fluctuate marginally on a daily basis, these fluctuations are not significant.
