NOTICE OF MOTION

The Hon R M Clinton has given notice on 12th December 2016 that he proposes to move the following motion at the next meeting of Parliament:

"This House notes that the Government in the 2016/17 Budget estimates indicated that both the office of Chief Secretary and the office of Principal Auditor were to be awarded pay increases of 28.21% from £123,219 to £157,978 each.

This House further notes that other offices holders originally on the same pay scale namely the Attorney General, the Financial Secretary, the Commissioner of Police and the Chief Technical Officer have been given the standard civil service increase of 2.75% in 2016/17 from £123,319 to £126,608.

Notes that the Government has in recent months created a department for Public Sector Efficiency and such an award seems inconsistent and potentially inflammatory to the wider Civil Service.

Calls on the Chief Minister to explain to this House why the offices of Chief Secretary and Principal Auditor merit pay increases that equate to more than 10 times that of the agreed Civil Service pay award of 2.75% in 2016/17."
